



# Golden Buddha & Hidden Streets Walk

- 13.00** Bus Pick up at **ICON SIAM** (Please be ready 10 minutes before pick up time).
- 13.30** Arrive at **Wat Traimit**, is home to the Golden Buddha, a Sukhothai-style statue made of solid gold. Recognized by the Guinness Book of World Records in 1991 as the world's largest solid gold Buddha, it symbolizes Thailand's rich cultural heritage. Originally covered in plaster to conceal its value, the statue revealed its golden core during relocation in 1955. Today, it stands as a powerful spiritual and cultural landmark in Bangkok. Visit **The Grand Postal Building**, located on Charoen Krung Road in Bangkok's Bang Rak district, is a historic landmark built in 1940 in the Art Deco style. Originally designed by Jitrasen Aphaiwong and Prince Saros Rattananimmman, it served as Thailand's central post office. Today, it stands as a striking architectural monument and cultural venue, often hosting exhibitions and events. Then take a walking tour through **Talat Noi** and explore the vibrant Street Art on Charoen Krung Soi 32 and 30, visit the creative community at Warehouse 30, and admire the historic charm of House No.1 House No.1, A century-old European-style mansion nestled in Bangkok's riverside Chinatown. Once a customs house for Chinese traders. **Enjoy tasting some local snacks and treats from Talat Noi — a charming neighborhood full of flavor and culture.
